Rhododendron Education in 2012

Your Chapter has been working on several fronts to help educate gardeners about the correct ways to successfully grow these plants in the eight states that comprise the Midwest Chapter. 2012 USDA Plant Hardiness Map

The USDA Plant Hardiness Map is the standard which gardeners and growers alike use to determine which plants are most likely to thrive in a given location.

Its important to note hardiness zones are based on the average annual extreme minimum temperatures during a 30-year period and not the lowest reported temperatures. The 2012 edition is based on 1976-2005 weather data. A trial check did not find the addition of more recent data made a significant difference to the results.

Below is a link to the website where you can reference the 2012 Hardiness Map. You can click on a state to see the various climate zones within the state. Also, a personal ZIP Code zone finder is included where you can simply type your ZIP Code in the proper box and your zone will be reported.
